





JENNIFER MINEAR, AILA PRESIDENT

Jennifer Minear was born in Baltimore and grew up in the Maryland suburbs of Washington, D.C. She attended the University of Maryland, College Park as an undergraduate, earning a degree in English and History, *cum laude*. After graduating from college, she worked as an immigration paralegal on business immigration cases for several different firms in D.C. and Boston before eventually heading to Cornell Law School, from which she graduated *cum laude* in 2001. During law school, Ms. Minear served as a managing editor of the *Cornell Journal of Law and Public Policy*, and studied international and comparative law during a summer abroad at the Sorbonne in Paris.

Following law school, Ms. Minear moved to Richmond, VA, working for several years as a civil litigator with the firm of Hunton & Williams. While at Hunton & Williams, Ms. Minear engaged in extensive pro bono work, including the representation of immigrants in processing immigrant self-petitions under the Violence Against Women Act. Then, in 2004, she made the decision to return to her first love—immigration law—full-time. She is currently a director in the immigration practice group of McCandlish Holton, PC in Richmond. Her practice focuses mainly on business immigration, with an emphasis on the healthcare sector, including the representation of international physicians and their employers through the J-1 waiver, H-1B, national interest waiver, and green card processes.

Ms. Minear has been actively involved with the AILA community for many years, working to improve our nation's immigration laws and policies. Her past work with AILA includes service on the Healthcare-Physicians Committee (chair), the U.S. Department of State Liaison Committee, the SSA/DMV/SAVE Taskforce (chair), the Annual Conference Committee, and the Nominating Committee. In addition, she has spent considerable time during her career lobbying for sensible immigration reform, having met with White House officials under the Obama administration, and continuing to meet regularly with members of Congress from both major parties. Ms. Minear also is a frequent contributor to AILA publications, has spoken on business immigration topics, by invitation, both nationally and internationally, and is frequently interviewed and quoted in the press on immigration topics. She is a past board member of the American Immigration Council, and was a member of the AILA Board of Governors for three years. In 2015, Ms. Minear was elected to the AILA Executive Committee, where she served for several years



as AlLA's liaison to the American Bar Association's Commission on Immigration. She is listed as a "Thought Leader" in the *International Who's Who of Corporate Immigration Attorneys*, and, in 2014, was named an "Influential Woman of Virginia" by *Virginia Lawyers Media*. That same year, Ms. Minear received the Susan D. Quarles AlLA Service Excellence Award, honoring her work during her career advancing the mission of AlLA.

Ms. Minear lives in Charlottesville, VA, with her amazing fiancé, Jason, three children, a (soon-to-be) stepdaughter, two dogs, and a cat. She enjoys spending time with her family and friends, traveling, history, listening to music, reading, taking long walks, trying new restaurants, and indulging in a well-crafted gin cocktail.
